Veterans Administration Benefits Support

- PVA membership is free, and we do not charge for our services
- \$230.5M+ in new annual and retroactive payments to Veterans and their families secured
- Over 23,000 new claims filed annually
- We are the only VSO given exclusive access in side all of VA's 25 SCI/D Medical Centers



Vehicle & Housing Grants

- \$39M+ in automobile adaptive equipment grants facilitated
- \$29.9M+ in specially adapted housing grants facilitated
- Pro bono architectural consultations about modifications to homes, workplaces, retail spaces, and public buildings



High Court Representation

- We employ a team of six licensed lawyers
 - 347 Clients Represented
 - 32 Federal Court Appeals
 - 319 VA decisions received
 - 72.9% favorable decision rating
- Mentored over 1,000 private attorneys who volunteered to represent Veterans without charge before the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veteran Claims



Promoting Healing Through Activity

- Over 2,300 Veterans participate in our 399 adaptive sports and recreation programs
- Rugby Invitational Tournament: 152 athletes; 15 teams; 48 games
- Co-presented the Annual National Veterans Wheelchair Games alongside the VA: 300+ Athletes; 20+ Sporting Events
- PVA's commitment to promoting healing through activity ensures that Veterans have the tools and opportunities they need for recovery.

Support for ALS & MS Veterans

- PVA represents 75% of Veterans with ALS and about 8,000 surviving spouses. One in four PVA members suffers from MS, and since expanding membership, we gained 400 new members
- Through a PVA fellowship, the FDA approved a medication called "Qalsody" aimed at slowing the progression of ALS



Fighting for Disability Civil Rights

- 12 Congressional testimonies to advocate for the rights of Veterans with disabilities
- 5K+ participants in our Grassroots advocacy network
- Released six PVA legislative advocacy policy priorities to guide current Congressional session



Veterans Career Program

- FREE employment support to ALL veterans, transitioning service members, spouses, and caregivers
- Veterans placed by PVA earn an average salary of nearly \$70K, which is 35% above the national average for Veterans
- 223 Clients Placed
- 40 Education/Training Programs



Increasing Quality of Life

- Research Grants and Fellowships \$899K*+ Total Funding
- We fund research grants and fellowships for researchers focused on finding a cure for paralysis and improving the quality of life for those with SCI/D, MS, and ALS
